



Be a Zoo Keeper for the day!

Bookings for either a ***Zoo Keeper for the day*** or a ***Junior Keeper for the day*** are available daily throughout the year, except Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. We have employed an extra member of staff to operate the scheme and this ensures that it runs efficiently and professionally, giving our participants one to one attention.

There are a number of rules that must be adhered to and we have listed these on a separate sheet. Please note – the confirmation of an up to date tetanus vaccination is required before a booking can be made.

The scheme is extremely popular with weekend and school holiday days being booked up well in advance. Consequently we advise you to telephone our booking office on 01323 874100 extension 201 to check availability before completing and returning the application form.

The price for both ***Keeper for the day*** and ***Junior Keeper for the day*** is £150 for 2010 weekdays and £170 for weekends and East Sussex School Holidays.

The price for both ***Keeper for the day*** and ***Junior Keeper for the day*** is £160 for 2011 weekdays and £180 for weekends and East Sussex School Holidays.

The day starts when you meet your keeper at the zoo entrance at 10:00am and includes activities such as – capybara, penguin, beaver and even lemur feeding! There is the chance to see and have a go at preparing feeds and enrichment for some of our animals.

The enclosed sheet headed ***a typical day*** shows in a lot more detail the range of animals and tasks that a ***Keeper for the day*** or ***Junior Keeper for the day*** is likely to encounter, however there is rarely a typical day as a Zoo Keeper, and we cannot guarantee that you will be able to work with any particular animals.

We request that only one adult (parent or guardian, but no other children) accompanies those with special needs or 6-9 year old Junior Keepers for the day, throughout their time at the Park.

The day finishes at approximately 4:15pm with the presentation of a certificate.

✦ ***Don't forget your camera*** – there are plenty of photo opportunities!

Cancellation rules are as follows:

- If we are given 14 or more days notice of a cancellation – a 50% refund will be applicable.
- If we are given less than 14 days notice of cancellation – we regret that no refund is possible.
- In circumstances where we are able to re-book another Keeper for the Day (regardless of the notice given) a 100% refund will be given.

Keeper and Junior Keeper for the day – Rules and Conditions

1. The minimum age of a Keeper for the day is 10 years old.
2. The minimum age of a Junior Keeper for the day 6 years old.
3. The maximum age of a Junior Keeper for the day is 9 years old.
4. Your tetanus vaccination must be up to date.
5. A parent or guardian must accompany a Junior Keeper for the day, and will be allowed in free of charge.
6. If appropriate, a carer must accompany a Keeper for the day with special needs, and will be allowed in free of charge.
7. Up to **four** additional family members can visit the Zoo on the day at our standard group rates – our normal opening time is 10.00am.
8. With the exception of the guardian for a Junior Keeper for the day, or the carer for a Keeper for the day with special needs, additional family members are not permitted behind the scenes.
9. No smoking or chewing of gum is permitted in the public areas.
10. Please wear appropriate clothing – Jeans, T-shirt, jumper or sweatshirt and appropriate waterproof coat or jacket.
11. Please wear appropriate waterproof footwear – Trainers and or wellington boots.
12. Squash, tea and coffee are provided free of charge in the keeper's staff room. Food can be purchased from our catering outlets or you may bring a packed lunch if you prefer.

Keeper and Junior Keeper for the day – Health and Safety

All animals naturally carry a range of micro-organisms, some of which can be transmitted to humans where they may cause ill health. The animals also have the potential to cause harm through biting, scratching and their physical presence. Therefore it is essential that those taking part in Keeper for a Day follow closely the instructions given. Behind the scenes at Drusillas there are other work activities being carried out which may present a risk if these guidelines are not followed.

1. All participants in the scheme must have an up to date tetanus vaccination.
2. Cover existing cuts and abrasions on exposed skin with waterproof dressings and the disposable gloves provided.
3. Smoking, eating or drinking is only allowed in the designated rest areas.
4. Do not eat any of the food intended for the animals.
5. Hands should be washed at every opportunity, especially before eating, drinking or smoking and before leaving Drusillas.
6. Always use the disposable gloves provided when instructed.
7. During the day you should avoid putting you face close to the animals, placing your fingers in your mouth or kissing the animals.
8. You should remain in close contact with the Zoo Keeper who you are working with, and not wander off.
9. You must not enter an animal enclosure without specific instruction from the Zoo Keeper.
10. You must not touch, stroke or pet any animal unless you are told it acceptable to do so by the Zoo Keeper.
11. If you take your breaks or lunch apart from the Zoo Keeper you must arrange to meet up again in a public area of the Park at a set time. You must not re-enter the off-show areas of the zoo unaccompanied.
12. No jewellery other than ear studs is permitted.
13. Long hair should be tied back.
14. High-heeled shoes should not be worn.
15. Any accident or injury should be reported to the Zoo Keeper immediately so that appropriate action can be taken and First Aid provided.
16. In the event of an emergency you should follow the instructions of the Zoo Keeper. If you become separated leave the area by the nearest emergency exit and make your way to the assembly point in the Car Park.

10.00am to 11.15am	Tour of kitchens and off show areas Feed farm animals and groom donkeys Clean top meerkats
11.30am to 1.15pm	Prepare food for, prairie dogs and llamas Feed and clean llamas Feed and clean capybaras Feed meerkats and prairie dogs Participate in the 1pm lemur feed and keeper talk
1.45pm to 4.15pm	Snake, insect and small mammal handling Feed capybara, mara and beavers Participate in the 4pm penguin feed and keeper talk

A typical day – Junior Keeper for the Day (aged 6 – 9 years)

10.00am to 11.15am	Tour of kitchens and off show areas Feed farm animals and groom donkeys Meerkat scatter feed
11.30am to 1.15pm	Prepare food for prairie dogs and meerkats Feed and handling of rabbits and guinea pigs Feed llamas Feed prairie dogs and meerkats Participate in the 1pm lemur feed and keeper talk
2.15pm to 4.15pm	Prepare enrichment for bats, capybara and the animals in Petworld Snake, insect and small mammal handling Put out enrichment in enclosures Feed capybara, mara and beavers Participate in the 4pm penguin feed and keeper talk
